Did You Know?

On average, your refrigerator/freezer produces about 8 percent of your household's energy costs. There are several ways to reduce this expense:

- Check thermostat controls. A fridge works most efficiently when set between 38°F and 40°F, and a freezer at 0°F.
- If you have a manual defrost freezer, don't forget to defrost it regularly. More than 1/4 inch of frost makes your freezer work harder to keep your food, and the frost, frozen.
- Keep it level. An un-level refrigerator may cause the door gasket to seal improperly letting the cold air leak out. Set a glass of water on top and adjust the legs until the unit looks level.
- Keep it closed. A fridge works most efficiently when you open

the door as infrequently as possible.
